

ROGERS GRAVESTONE RECORDS. Mr. Arthur E. Linnell of Boston has made and given to the Society copies of the inscriptions on nine Rogers gravestones in a family burying ground on the estate of Joshua¹ Rogers (Joshua², Ebenezer³, John⁴⁻⁸, Joseph⁹, Thomas¹⁰), at South Orleans, Mass., now owned by Elnathan E. Eldredge. The genealogical facts are as follows:

Mercy, wife of Joshua, died 29 December, 1842, aged 92.
 Joshua, died 30 June, 1863, aged 90 years, 1 month, 6 days.
 Deborah, wife of Joshua, died 17 April, 1842, aged 65.
 Debby, daughter of Joshua and Debby, died 20 May, 1816, aged 3 years, 1 month, 18 days.
 Marshal, died 24 September, 1837, aged 23.
 Polly Young, died 15 November, 1829, aged 27.
 Isaiah M., aged 5 months. [No date.]
 Isaiah M., son of Isaiah Y. and Olive, lost at sea in the spring of 1849, aged 18 years.
 Melissa, daughter of Isaiah Y. and Olive, died 5 August, 1842, aged 1 year, 9 months, 17 days. [On stone of Isaiah M. who died 1849.]
 Isaiah M., son of Isaiah Y. and Olive, died 27 August, 1877, aged 27.

BOOK NOTES

CAPTAIN MYLES STANDISH. Under this title Tudor Jenks has written, and the Century Company, New York, has published a 250-page volume, which is well suited for young readers as an epitome of Pilgrim history. The actual knowledge of the doughty chieftain is small; this work weaves around all ascertained facts the familiar story of the Pilgrim migrations from England to the Netherlands and from Amsterdam to Plymouth.
